

Alan Day, as my Consort attended the Marshchapel Civic Service, as I was unwell.


We both attended the Sleaford Civic Service on Sunday 18 May 2025. It was very poorly attended, which I found really sad, as so much planning goes into these occasions.

Once again the crew have had a busy few months with them attending 70 calls in the last 3 months! With 17 incidents being of 4 appliances or higher, what we would call a medium sized incident. Most of these larger incidents have been in Boston and Lincoln.

In the last edition, I informed you about the retirement of Crew Manager Craig Marchbank At the beginning of May a new Crew Manager was appointed, Chris Clarke. He didn't have it easy as the other hopeful for the position performed extremely well in the process, in fact the Assessors noted that both performed to a very high standard, and demonstrated incredible professionalism.



Halton Holegate CE Primary School is a very small school but we like to think we punch well above our weight! As the Book of Samuel says, people look at the outward appearance, but the Lord looks at the heart! With currently 62 children, we are proud of our vision of ensuring that children flourish and fulfil their potential as we prepare them for the next stage of their education. So what things do we do? The three small classes have experienced a wide variety of events this year; visits to the school by a dinosaur and a chocolatier (not on the same day!), termly visits to St Andrew's church in the village, participated in the Spilsby Music Festival and a number of inter-school sport events, raised money for Lincs & Notts Air Ambulance, held termly Culture Days, a residential trip for our Year 5 and 6 children to How Stean Gorge in Yorkshire and a very special VE Day event in the playground with many families and neighbours helping us to celebrate 80 years since the end of World War 2.














TOWN CLERK'S UPDATE

I hope your summer is going well. The Town Council continue to work hard to have a positive impact in the community. Cllr Liz Day has been re-elected to the role of the Town's Mayor for the forthcoming term of office, Cllr Day's second year in the role.

CONSULTATION

In the Spring edition of the Explorer Magazine, we included a consultation, which could be completed using the paper in the Explorer, via email or online. Many thanks to all the residents who completed the survey. It has provided valuable feedback; much of which was for issues outside of the Town Council's control, however, your views help us champion those causes to the relevant bodies. A summary of the feedback will be made available on the Town Council's website.

PLAY AREA

The Town Council installed new equipment in the play area at the Recreation Ground on Ancaster Avenue which officially opened on the 216th anniversary of Sir John Franklin's birth. After feedback in our recent consultation, the Town Council will look to install additional equipment in phase 2 of the project, such as equipment for toddlers, benches and waste bins. We have also contacted local schools to ask pupils to choose new equipment. This is an exciting idea as we hope it will show the children that their choices can make a difference in their community. Please remember the play area equipment is designed for 3–12-year-olds.

Spilsby Recreation Ground Developments

It has been a while since we updated the public on our ambitious plans, so this issue of the Explorer is a great place to do that. Since the last Explorer, the Pavilion & Recreation Ground Trustees have successfully been granted Planning Permission for the development of the Pavilion and the expanded Car Park, ref S/165/00200/24.

We have decided to complete our development in four phases,

Phase One - Playzone (September 2025)

Phase Two - Car Park (September 2025)

Phase Three - Pavilion (2025 Onwards)

Phase Four - Skate Park (2026/27)

A lot of hard work, time and money has been spent ensuring we cover all bases for the future of this community asset. We all know that the current set up is outdated, and we need to develop to bring in line with Safeguarding, the increased demand, and new footballing requirements.

As the Explorer is a Community Wide Publication, the Trustees would like to take this opportunity to highlight the important elements we have covered that affect you, the residents and users.

- 1 Better changing facilities for the footballing teams as we look to increase demand. Introduce women's and disability football to the area. New changing rooms, showers and toilet cubicles.
- 2 A new Clubhouse/Cafe/Bar for local residents, footballers, spectators and pavilion users. Allowing more functions, more events and an increased revenue stream.
- 3 A new Site Office, so a Full Time Site Manager, available because of the increased revenue and needed to oversee the site, security, the facilities and any issues. Hopefully this will add a new layer of security and peace of mind for those near the Pavilion.
- 4 A new Hall, used as an overspill for the current hall as it is used most evenings. Both halls will now join to make a larger space for events like presentation evenings, Spilsby Show, kids parties and other events.
- 5 Increased Car Park We know the parking is a nightmare, and we've addressed this. A new reinforced Gravel Car park provides better parking and hopefully an end to parking over resident driveways. Electric charging points, parking for Mini Buses and more spaces.

- 6 A new Meeting Room for meetings, training and community development courses.
- 7 Solar Panels for better energy efficiency.
- 8 A state of the art Skate Park, for multi-use and all ages.
- 9 A 2G All Weather Hard Court that can be used for Multi-Sport. Lockable, and bookable.

The Trustees want to explain everything, and hopefully we've done this here. It is an exciting time, a time to sort out issues that you've expressed in the community engagement. It is exciting to envisage the potential of the Pavilion in the years to come. The area is underfunded and the Town, Footballers, Residents and Visitors deserve a facility that delivers in all areas.

Please understand the Trustees are all volunteers, and sometimes they can't reply straightaway, but they'll try their very best.

ROTARY CLUB OF SPILSBY

Summer time is handover time for Rotary Clubs and Rodney Hobson's year as President of the Rotary Club of Spilsby has come to an end. The incoming President is Bill Wallace, who moved to Lincolnshire two years ago but brings a wealth of knowledge on Rotary matters, having been President at Hebden Bridge in Yorkshire and in the Orkneys in the past.

It has been an eventful 12 months, culminating in Spilsby Rotary being awarded the coveted Contribution to the Community Award at the Town Council's Recognition Award Event at the Franklin Hall in June.

President Rodney explained to the audience that although Spilsby Rotary is part of an international organisation, it has a strong ethos of service to the town and surrounding area, providing financial support to worthy local causes as well as organising Firework Night, a Christmas concert in St James's Church with singing by pupils at local schools, the erection and dismantling of the town's Christmas Tree and a highly popular tribute band act.

Bike Night was probably the best since Spilsby Rotary took over organising the annual event a few years ago. A warm summer afternoon and evening brought out bikers and local residents in their droves – in fact there were so many motorbikes that even the overflow parking lot overflowed!

Many remarked that they had never seen so many people in Spilsby before as stalls, cafes and shops did a roaring trade. A great band from Boston, 11th Hour, had young and old rocking in the central area.

To make sure that the year ended with a bang, the President, who has written several books of Lincolnshire detective fiction published on Kindle, penned a murder mystery performed by fellow Rotarians and partners on the evening of the handover to the new president.

Rodney acted the part of Charles Windsor, newly installed head of a Lincolnshire family of widget makers, who had gathered his family together at their Illmoral Estate to discuss his plans to slim down the establishment following the recent death of his mother, the long-serving matriarch of the family. Unfortunately, brother Andrew had brought along an unwelcome and unsuitable old flame while daughter-in-law Meghan Marmite sat sulking in her room, refusing to join the gathering. Sister Anne thought she should be running the company while Charles's sons William and Harry were at loggerheads. What could possibly go wrong?

May turned into a month for reminiscing and storytelling. Normally the Club, which meets at the Nelson Butt on Thursday nights, does not hold a meeting in a week containing a Bank Holiday but as the 80th anniversary of VE Day fell on a Thursday an extra meeting was called to celebrate the big day. No-one present was old enough to remember the original VE Day but the President's wife Judy brought along Mrs Bruin, a female teddy bear that had been made towards the end of the Second World War by an Airman at RAF Spilsby.

Spilsby Sessions House Spilsby

Spilsby Sessions House is one of two culturally significant, heritage at-risk attractions which East Lindsey District Council secured Government funding to help attract new visitors and to create a multi-use area for everyone to enjoy.

This collaborative project between East Lindsey District Council and the Spilsby Sessions House Trust has reached a new milestone with a planning application and listed building consent begin submitted to respectfully restore the Grade II listed Spilsby Sessions House into a multi-use community facility.

The restoration project will not only allow the building to be operational again, but it will support the economy of Spilsby as the space will be able to be leased out. New designs were released as part of the planning application which show the potential restoration of the building to allow a multi-use space to maximise the use of the attraction for generations to come.

By improving the access into the Sessions House, the building will be a welcoming space for everyone. A new café area is part of the plans which would not only serve local people but also visitors to the Lincolnshire Wolds and Coast.

This follows detailed preparations and surveys on the site over the past few months, which have been able to shape the design and inform the team about the condition of the building and the history behind it.

Pranali Parikh, Director of Economic Development, said: "The submission of planning and listed building consent for Spilsby Sessions House marks a significant milestone in this project.

"The very detailed on-site work conducted so far has been invaluable, providing the project team with crucial insights and information necessary for the next phase of the programme, subject to planning and listed building approval.

"This is an important and historic building for Spilsby and a key piece of the vibrant cultural tapestry of East Lindsey. Subject to approval the scheme will enhance the heritage asset, support the local economy and generate visitors for the Lincolnshire Wolds."
